



What Costs are Involved to be a Scout?

Annual Membership Fee <i>(includes all awards earned, neckerchief for next rank, den crafts, offsets cost of pack activities, Space Derby Rocket, Pinewood Derby Car, Regatta Boat, Blue & Gold Dinner, food for pack events, etc.)</i>	\$100
Uniform <i>(approximate costs)</i> Scout Shirt <i>(blue shirt worn for 3 years)</i> Scout Pants – Optional <i>(Pack 64 allows jeans to be the required pants for uniform)</i> Scout Cap <i>(rank specific)</i> Belt and Belt Buckle Patches <i>(5 needed @ approx. \$1.50-\$2.00 each)</i> Neckerchief <i>(first year of scouting)*</i> Neckerchief Slide <i>(rank appropriate)</i>	\$25 \$25-\$40 \$15 \$10 \$10 \$9 \$6
* <i>after the first year of scouting, Pack 64 provides rank appropriate neckerchief each year</i>	
Handbook <i>(rank appropriate)</i>	\$13
Approximate Start-Up Cost Total <i>(not including cost of Scout Pants)</i>	\$188

Costs associated with activities (monthly outings, optional overnights, etc.) the Pack plans are dependent on the activity. Pack activities are optional. It is also up to you to decide which, if any, activities your scout participates. Therefore those costs are not mandatory to be a scout. If you don't attend or participate, there is no cost to you or your family.

Twice a year, during popcorn sales (September) and camp card sales (April/May), scouts have the chance to earn money into his scout account by participating in selling these items. The money that is placed into his account may be used for activities, annual member fee or camps! It is not mandatory that scouts sell popcorn or camp cards. The choice is yours whether to sell or not.
